Questions for reading: 'Why don't they learn English?'

Tse tackles two widespread beliefs about language in the US: Immigrants don't learn English and don't encourage their children to. We've already talked about these issues historically, but this is a contemporary perspective.

- 1. She first examines the reasons given by people for why they hold the beliefs just noted. What are they?
- 2. What particular role do these views give to bilingual education and 'English Only' in education?
- 3. Who are immigrants to the US up to when she wrote (2001)? Does Wisconsin pattern differently from the national trend?
- 4. What evidence does she present on the learning of English among immigrants? What about children of immigrants? What conclusions does she reach for both groups?
- 5. How do children of immigrants compare in school to other children?
- 6. What challenges do immigrants face in learning English? (This is one of the most important points she makes in the book.)
- 7. If the evidence is this clear about immigrants and their children learning English, why do these beliefs persist?
