- 3. What patterns are there in those lists? For instance, were there more words than you expected that you didn't know? Words you expected to be discussed that weren't?
- 4. Vocabulary is often very local. What words do you associate with your hometown, family, friends as particularly distinctive?
- 5. Vocabulary also changes very quickly. What words do your parents or grandparents use that you would never use? What words do you use that they would never use?
- 6. What words do you use that people commented on when you came to Madison?
- 7. What new words have you learned on campus that you associate with being a UW student?
- 8. What names do you know that refer to people from Wisconsin? From other nearby states?
